

Adding "APHASIA" to Your Medical ID on Your Phone: iPhone Users

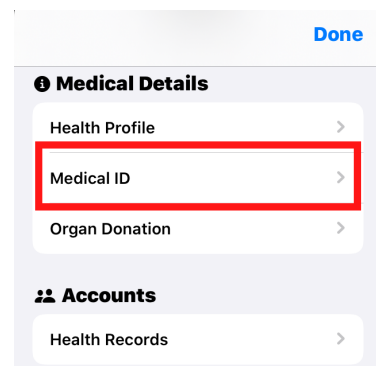
1. Find the "health" app on your phone. This app will already be installed on your iPhone.



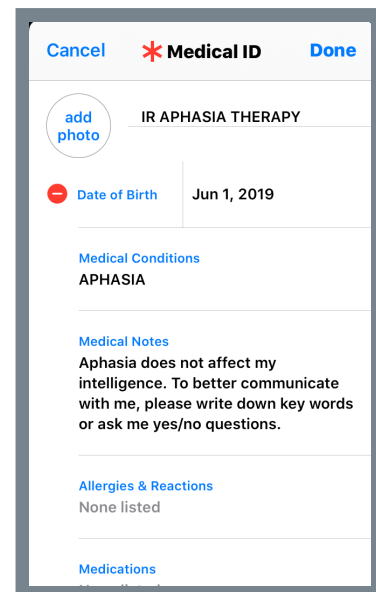
2. Open the app and tap on your initial in the top right corner.



3. Tap on "Medical ID"



4. Tap on "Edit" in the top right corner.



5. Add "Aphasia" to your list of medical conditions. Under medical notes, you can add the definition of Aphasia or a list of communication strategies that will help you communicate.



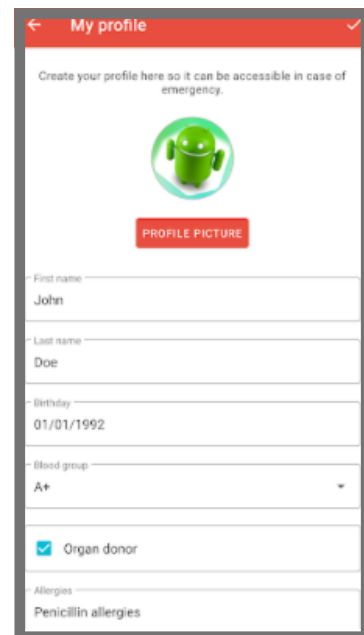
Adding “APHASIA” to Your Medical ID on Your Phone: Android Users

1. Most Android devices do not have a built in Medical ID app. Therefore, you will have to download an app from the Google Play Store. Android offers several free In Case of Emergency (ICE) apps. The one we will be showing is called "ICE- In Case of Emergency". At this time, we do not recommend one app over another.



2. Follow the app instructions for set-up.

3. Under your profile, you will be able to add your personal medical information. Add "Aphasia" to your list of medical conditions. You can add the definition of Aphasia or a list of communication strategies that will help you communicate.



4. The app will create a permanent notification on your lock screen. This will allow first responders to view your medical information that you list.
